U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at the Byron Barrel & Drum Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its third five-year review of the implemented remedy at the **Byron Barrel & Drum Superfund site**, located in the Byron Township, Genesee County, New York. This review seeks to confirm that the implemented remedy continues to protect human health and the environment. The last five-year review was conducted in September 2012. A summary of the review and an evaluation of the protectiveness of the implemented remedies will be included in a five-year review report.

What is a Five-Year Review?

The purpose of a five-year review is to ensure that implemented remedies at Superfund sites function as intended and continue to be protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- review of monitoring data, operating data and maintenance records, and
- determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.

When will the Five-Year Review Report be available?

It is anticipated that the five-year review report will be available at the website noted below before September 2017.
